2022**

**Anglo Saxons and Vikings**

**Mathematics**

Children will continue to develop their mathematical understanding in regular mathematics lessons. They will build on and consolidate their learning through practical work, practise and have the opportunity to use their learning to solve puzzles and problems. Our programme of study will include the following:

- Identifying and comparing angles
- In depth study of triangles and quadrilaterals
- Calculating angles and lengths in shapes
- Statistics
- Regular and irregular polygons
- Position and direction
- Coordinates in all 4 quadrants-including translation, rotation and reflection.

The pitch and pace of the work will be sensitive to the needs and rate of learning of all the children in class.

Year 6 will also have revision sessions in preparation for SATs.

**PE**

PE is twice a week on a Wednesday and Thursday. On these days, pupils will need to wear their PE kit to school. *They will need to keep a spare pair of shoes/trainers/trousers (clearly named) in school to change in to if their PE kit gets wet or muddy.*

**GWS - Let Our Light Shine**

**PSHE**

PSHE will be taught through three main themes; Health and Well-being, Relationships and Living in the Wider World.

**Lifelong Learning Values** - During this term we will be focusing on responsibility and empathy.

**Growth Mindset** - this recognizes that everyone's intellectual ability can always be further developed.

**Topic** - We will learn about:

- significant events from the period and order these chronologically on a timeline.
- the Anglo-Saxon kings who ruled during the 'Viking Age' and examine their influence and significance in British history.
- the Anglo-Saxon justice system and compare and contrast crimes, punishments and laws with their modern day equivalents.
- different aspects of everyday Viking life.
- who the Vikings were and when and where they raided and settled.



**Art and DT**

We will:

Study Viking artefacts and start to learn about different styles of Viking art.

Learn how to draw intricate Viking knots, animal heads, Viking dragons and developing shading skills.

Weave or sculpt to make Viking jewellery decorated with runes.

**French & Music (with Mrs Welch)**

**English**

There will be a strong emphasis this term on text and performance. We will begin our work with studying poetic devices. We will read and write poetry for performance. We will move on to study the text Beowulf. The aim of this work is to give children the opportunity to write their own hero myth based on the text. We will continue to study grammar, punctuation and spelling in discreet lessons.

Year 6 will be prepared for their SATs tests in May through revision sessions to recap on their learning throughout KS2.

**Computing (with Mrs Green)**

As part of our online safety lessons, we will be focusing on health, wellbeing and lifestyle and privacy and security.

We will continue to develop our programming skills. We will use computers and iPads for research to support learning in other areas of the curriculum.

**Science (Yr 5)**

During the first half term, we will be studying Earth and Space. We will be Identifying scientific evidence that has been used to support or refute ideas or arguments in the context of how ideas changed from a flat earth view. We will learn about the movement of the Earth, and other planets, relative to the Sun in the solar system by learning the order of the planets and how they move in the solar system. We will be thinking about the explanation of day and night and the apparent movement of the sun across the sky.

**RE**

We will be following the Essex scheme of work for RE at Key Stage 2,

**Judaism** - the Jewish home and the synagogue.

**Christianity** - the Bible
