Mathematics

Children will continue to develop their mathematical understanding in regular mathematics lessons. They will build on and consolidate their learning through practical work, practise and have the opportunity to use their learning to solve puzzles and problems. Our programme of study will include the following:

- Number and place value
- Addition and subtraction
- Multiplication and division
- Perimeter
- Fractions
- Decimals and percentages
- Measurement
- Time
- Statistics
- Angles
- Area
- Shape and symmetry
- Position and direction

The pitch and pace of the work will be sensitive to the needs and rate of learning of all the children in class.

PE

PE will be twice a week on a Thursday and a Friday. On these days, pupils will need to wear their PE kit to school. They will need to keep a spare pair of shoes/trainers/trousers (clearly named) in school to change in to if their PE kit gets wet or muddy.

PSHE

PSHE will be taught through three main themes; Health and Well-being, Relationships and Living in the Wider World. **Lifelong Learning Values** - During this term we will be focusing on responsibility and empathy.

Growth Mindset - this recognizes that everyone's intellectual ability can always be further developed.

Topic - We will learn about:

- who the Vikings were and when and where they raided and settled.
- significant events from the period and order these chronologically on a timeline.
- the Anglo-Saxon kings who ruled during the 'Viking Age' and examine their influence and significance in British history.
- the Anglo-Saxon justice system and compare and contrast crimes, punishments and laws with their modern day equivalents.
- different aspects of everyday Viking life.



Art and DT

We will:

Study Viking artefacts and start to learn about different styles of Viking art.

Learn how to draw intricate Viking knots, animal heads, Viking dragons and developing shading skills.

Weave or sculpt to make Viking jewellery decorated with runes.

French & Music (with Mrs Welch)

English

Our English lessons will be linked to our topic work where possible. We will explore Beowulf, an epic poem written in Old English. We will use this text as a basis for writing character descriptions, descriptions of settings, letters and newspaper reports. When writing, we will plan, draft, write, proof read, evaluate and edit our work.



Computing (with Mrs Green)

As part of our online safety lessons, we will be focusing on health, wellbeing and lifestyle and privacy and security.

We will continue to develop our programming skills. We will use computers and iPads for research to support learning in other areas of the curriculum.

Science (Yr 4)

During the first half term, we will continue to focus on animals including humans. We will learn about the simple functions of the basic parts of the digestive system in humans, identifying the different types of teeth in humans and their functions and further developing our knowledge of food chains.

Our focus will them move to living things and their environments.
