Class North America Curriculum overview Spring
Term, 2024 (please note planning can be subject to change)

English

In our English lessons we will be studying the text Carrie's War by Nina Bawden. From this text we will be thinking about writing reflectively from a character's point of view.

We will move onto study the Diary of Anne Frank. This will be the stimulus for writing our own version of Anne's diary and letters that she wrote at the time.

We will continue to have weekly reading comprehension sessions and grammar punctuation and spelling. Topics we will focus on are-clauses, word classes, advanced punctuation types and active voice.

Year 6 will also complete revision tasks in preparation for the SATs in May.

Geography

As part of our topic on World War II, we will identify the countries of the Allies and the Axis on a world map. In addition to this, we will be learning about our European neighbours.

History - World War 2

Topics that we will look at are-how the war began, the Blitz, evacuees, air raids and air raid shelters, rationing, experiences of Jewish children during the war and Jewish prisoner of war camps and to consider how the war affected people's everyday lives.

Computing

Using technology —The children will use the computers to communicate and present their learning from across the curriculum.

Research – The children will use the computers and iPads to research other areas of the curriculum.

Online safety- Online Relationships/Online Bullying -The children will continue to revisit and build on their understanding of how to stay safe when working or playing online

In our weekly lessons we will continuing with webpage designing and then learning about Variables in games.

Science

Y6- we will finish our work on evolution and then begin out topic on how we see. We will be thinking about reflection and refraction. We will then learn about how a prism changes a ray of light to show the spectrum.. We will conclude our work with light enables us to see colours.

Mathematics

Children will continue to develop their mathematical understanding in regular mathematics lessons.

Our programme of study will include the following:
