**Curriculum Title – Sow, Grow and Farm**

**'Let all that you do be done in love'**

### Mathematics

In the Spring Term, our maths is organised into 4 key sequenced learning blocks comprising of:

**Multiplication and Division:** In this unit, pupils will develop their understanding of multiplication and division, building from simpler calculations to more complex, efficient methods. They will learn how to multiply and divide larger numbers accurately and apply these skills to solve a range of problems.

**Fractions:** In this unit, pupils will deepen their understanding of fractions. They will learn how to multiply fractions by whole numbers and use this knowledge to solve practical problems involving amounts.

**Decimals and Percentages:** In this unit, pupils will develop a secure understanding of decimals, fractions and percentages, and how these representations are connected. They will build fluency with place value and use it to read, write, compare and round decimal numbers.

**Area and Perimeter:** In this unit, pupils will develop their understanding of perimeter and area and how these measurements are calculated and applied.

### Art

In Spring 1, our project title is – 'Line, Light and Shadows.' This project teaches the children about the visual qualities of line, light and shadow. We will explore the work of Pablo Picasso and Rembrandt and be introduced to a range of shading techniques.

In Spring 2, our project title is – 'Nature's Art'  
This project teaches children about the genre of land art. They will work outdoors to sketch natural forms and explore the sculptural potential of natural materials before working collaboratively to create land art installations.



### Geography

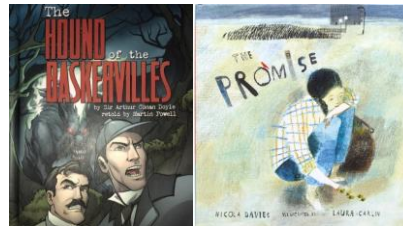
This term's project, 'Sow, Grow and Farm', teaches children about the features and characteristics of land use in agricultural regions across the world, including a detailed exploration of significant environmental areas.

Pupils will learn about allotments, plant life cycles, seasonality and the origins of food, farming in the UK, the impact of modern farming and farming across the globe.



### English

We will be studying the text, 'The Hound of the Baskervilles' by Arthur Conan Doyle. The children will work towards producing their own Cliffhanger Narrative and Formal Report. In the second half of the term, our work will be based on the novel 'The Promise', written by Nicola Davies. Pupils will write their own Character Narrative and Bargain Letter.



We will have regular reading sessions to embed inference and prediction skills. In addition, we will have a class story book that we will read daily. Reading is an essential skill for learning and this is at the heart of our ethos in class. The children will have short handwriting and spelling sessions throughout the week.

### RE

Our RE lessons are based on the new Essex Agreed Syllabus for Religious Education. The syllabus promotes a multi-disciplinary study of religion and worldviews, developing children's knowledge and curiosity about the world in which they live. It prepares them both for life within the large and diverse County of Essex, but also in the wider world, where they will encounter a huge range of ideas and beliefs.

Our two key questions this term are:

1. Why is the Torah so important to Jewish people?
2. Creation and science: conflicting or complementary?

### Music

Our music specialist, Mrs Welch, will be teaching two exciting units across the Spring term:

Unit 1: Young Voices

Unit 2: Enjoying musical styles

### French

This term, we will be broadening our knowledge of the French language through two exciting topics:

- 'Do you have a pet?'
- 'What is the weather?'

### Computing

This term, we will be covering the following topics:

- Selection in Physical Computing
- Flat-file data bases

### Science

This term's project is called, 'Human Reproduction and Ageing'

This project teaches children about animal life cycles, including the human life cycle. We will explore human growth and development to old age.



### DT

Linked closely to our Geography topic, our unit title for DT is 'Eat the Seasons.'

This project teaches children about the meaning and benefits of seasonal eating, including food preparation and cooking techniques.

### P.E.

Pupils will have P.E. on Thursdays and Fridays.

This term, we will be developing our skills in Dance, Basketball, Gymnastics and Tennis.

### PSHE

PSHE will be taught through three main themes:
